Dear Professor Barth,

I was very pleased to have your postcard of 13th June and wish to thank you for the opportunity of coming to see you, in Bonn.

I expect to arrive in Köln-Brück on the evening of Tuesday 23rd July, and I could come to see you on the 25th (Wed), 26th (Thursday) or 27th (Friday) whichever day would be most suitable for you.

I would get it on arrival. It is quite convenient for me to come to Bonn at any time. I may spend a few days of that week in Bonn. Part of my wife's former home in 104 Argelanderstr is still at my disposal.

I should like to have the opportunity of discussing with you some of the points raised in Brunner's Natur und Gnade. The relation of revelation to natural religion is felt here also to be the burning point at the moment.

I have an article in this month's Expository Times dealing with the question in reference to the "German Christian" standpoint, which has called forth some correspondence, including a memorandum from Principal D. A. Cairns of Aberdeen whom you met at St Andrews.

I am enclosing a copy of this memorandum, and an extract from a private letter from Dr Jacks, the Editor of the Hibbert Journal, which will indicate some of the points I wish to discuss with you.
