Dear Professor Berke,

I am writing to say
how much pleasure it will give us
to welcome you in Scotland, where
your name is known and honoured.

May I put forward two requests?

- ① I am asked to inquire whether on
the occasion of your visit to Glasgow
you could find time to address a meet-
ing of ministers and theological students,
at which, after your lecture, questions
might be asked. I was instructed to
suggest to you the subject of "The Word
of God in its relation to Jesus Christ",
or, simply, "Christology".

(2) Professor Milligan, of Glasgow, told me last night that there was a possibility of your going on to St Andrews after Glasgow, and then still to Aberdeen. It will be a great joy to me if you will come to Edinburgh and be my guest on your way south from Aberdeen. If you can see your way to do this, I shall endeavour to arrange for you to find another address here, and I should find gladness in showing you a little of our beautiful city.

Unfortunately, I have long ago promised to be in England during the week June 14-21. So that I cannot

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not have the pleasure of seeing
you or hearing you in Glasgow.
But from the 23rd onwards I shall
be at home, and if you will come
to me after spending the week-end
(over Sunday the 21st) in Aberdeen,
I shall be delighted.
