TERE are two books in which two difficult writers make a valiant effort to express their thought in simple terms; for the most part they have succeeded excellently well in doing it. The first consists of a series of lectures on the Apostles' Creed delivered in Bonn. Readers who have found Barth's "Dogmatik" too heavy going are sure to welcome this volume, which will tell them all they need to know of Barth for ordinary purposes, and will bring them into contact with a razor-edged mind and a profoundly devout spirit. Dr. Barth takes the great clauses of the Creed one by one and expounds them from his own point of view. To many readers the division between God and man still will seem to be both arbitrary and untrue. Indeed, at many points, they will be compelled to ask themselves whether Dr. Barth's understanding of great central Christian doctrines really fits the facts as we know them in experience. But always one is conscious of a mind grappling fearlessly with the profoundest questions of Christian thought.

It may well be that Professor Tillich will in the end exert a far profounder and more lasting influence on thoughtful men than will Dr. Barth, for there is little doubt that his interpretation of history is one with which all realistic historians will have to come to terms. Nevertheless one has to learn his language before one can appreciate its value and we therefore give all the greater welcome to this volume of sermons. Even here some readers at least will have to exercise their minds to grapple, not so much with the language, as with the thought the language is made to carry, but the book is the work of a master mind and a profoundly Christian spirit. These are sermons for a world in which everything that can be shaken is being shaken, and they really do throw light, as few other books do, on the understanding of our time.
