KARL Barth's preaching to inmates of Basel prison, to which he has long made regular visits, is well known from *Deliverance to the Captives*, a collection of eighteen of his sermons. This new collection consists of twelve more sermons, again based on the central themes of the Gospel and presented with the same wisdom, honesty, consideration and reverence which so marked out its predecessor. Whether beginning from the Old Testament or the New, Barth has a unique gift of becoming a vehicle for conveying the majesty and the glory of God who is at the same time the God of mercy and loving-kindness.
