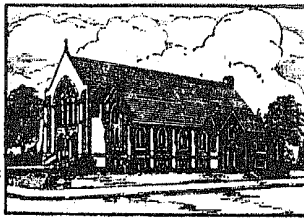

Dear Dr. Barth:

I am sending with this letter three samples of our translation of the whole volume of sermons. One is by myself, the others by Dr. Richards and Dr. Ernst. Professor Fauck could not help us and Dr. Horton said he had too many things to do. He will help us, I think, in getting it published. I hope that these three samples will be enough, since to send the whole one over would cost a considerable amount. We have them about finished, Dr. Richards still has four to translate but they will be finished by the middle of October. By that time we should start to get a publisher and make arrangements with Chr. Kaiser Verlag, that is if you are satisfied with the way we have translated.

I will write a brief introduction to the translation, and if you care to write a word for the English and American readers, I think it would a fine thing.

I am very busy this year. I was invited to teach in Butler University, a graduate course in Modern Church History.

I had a letter or two from Dr. Thurneysen and he is satisfied with whatever you are, since you know the situation better than he. I want to write him a long letter about Frank Buchman and the Oxford movement who have been working hard in England and Switzerland. I know Buchman and can tell him a number of things about his method and his theology.

As soon as you are finished with these translations I wish you would return them, as they are our only copies, together with your Foreword if you like.
