"Inasmuch as the historic testimony of the Presbyterian Church in all lands has been a witness for spiritual freedom, in defence of which men and women of the church have made great sacrifices of both life and substance; and, inasmuch as a great struggle for spiritual freedom is going on in Germany at the present time, on behalf of which several thousand protestant ministers have already taken their stand, having signed a declaration prepared by Prof. Karl Barth of the University of Bonn, to the effect that they will not allow the Fascist Government led by Herr Adolf Hitler to take from the church its supremacy in matters spiritual, and to that end they are prepared to endure hardship.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Synod of Saskatchewan of the Presbyterian Church in Canada send to these champions of spiritual freedom in Germany, the assurance of our sympathy, and continued prayers on their behalf, and our belief in the cause for which they stand, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Prof Barth by the Moderator of Synod."
