Dear Dr. Barth:

I shall never forget that pleasant afternoon above the lake near Zurich, and under separate cover I am sending you a copy of my new book, "His Own Received Him Not, But ..." in appreciation of your kindness.

In the January issue of our magazine I have written the story of our conversation and have attempted to interpret you in the most favorable light possible, to our readers. You will understand our point better if you realize that there are several million Christians scattered through the churches in America whose beliefs are not in formal Christianity but in the living vital power of the risen Christ, revealed in His Word. I do not know Germany well enough to make any good comparison, but our great groups of Bible Christians are perhaps most like Pastor Dolman or the faithful group at Wernigerode.

If you could find time to write us your impression on the religious situation in Germany today, about three thousand words, in popular, not-technical language, we would be glad to send you our editorial payment for the equivalent of twenty-five dollars, which, at present exchange rates, comes to about seventy-five marks. You could write in German or French and we would have it translated here.
