Dear Professor Barth,

I am sorry for not having written sooner to tell you how great pleasure it gave me to receive your letter of February 26th telling me of your willingness to contribute to the book on Revelation. I have not had a letter for a long time which gave me so much delight and encouragement. My reason for not having written sooner is partly that I have been away from home and partly that I have been laid up for some days with an attack of cold.
